The ERIE HUNT AND SADDLE CLUB, INC RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. The Erie Hunt and Saddle Club, Inc. (EHSC) strongly recommends that all horses enter the grounds have negative Coggins and current vaccinations recommended for this area. Negative Coggins is required for out-of-state horses.
- 2. The Erie Hunt and Saddle Club will not be responsible for any damage, injury or loss to persons, animals or property of exhibitors or spectators.
- 3. Every class offered herein which is covered by the current U.S.E.F. Rule Book will be conducted and judged in accordance with U.S.E.F. Standards. Any class not covered shall have the rules posted (available) in the secretary's office.
- 4. Any horse or rider disrupting a class will be excused from the class.
- 5. The rider's age is determined as of December 1st, of the preceding year.
- 6. All junior riders (17 and under) whenever mounted, or driving must wear ASTM-SEI approved headgear.
- 7. Stallions are prohibited in classes for Juniors.
- 8. Entries may be shown both English and Western with the appropriate tack and attire. All tack changes must be cleared with the announcer and paddock master.
- 9. For lack of entries, the show committee reserves the right to cancel or combine classes as necessary.
- 10. NO REFUNDS FOR SCRATCHED CLASSES.
- 11. In Equitation/H classes the rider is being judged. All other classes the horse is being judged.
- 12. All dogs must be leashed.
- 13. All riders in hunter classes must wear ASTM-SEI approved headgear.
 - A. Hunter Classes:
 - Standard nose bands must be used.
 - Standing martingales are allowed in over fence classes only.
 - No boots or wraps are allowed
 - B. Contest (Games) Classes:
 - Competitors must wear shirts with sleeves and hats or approved ASTM-SEI helmet if they are 17 and under.
 - Inappropriate tack or clothing may be penalized at the discretion of the judge.
 - C. Hobbles and lariats are optional in Stock Seat classes.
- 14. STALLS: To reserve a stall, contact the EHSC Stabling Chairperson. ALL STALLS MUST BE BEDDED. Shavings will be available for purchase, or you may bring your own. Stalls may not be claimed prior to 3:00 pm the day prior to the show except by contacting the Stabling Chairperson or Show Chairperson.
- 15. All motorized vehicles must be driven by a licensed driver; this includes golf carts, scooters, 4 wheelers, etc.

GENERAL JUMPING DERBY RULES

What is a jumper derby?

A jumping derby combines Stadium jumps (will fall when hit) and Cross-County jumps (solid & immovable) that might be encountered at an event or horse trials. These jumps are placed in an arena and a small field. This is a good test of your horse's willingness to jump a mix of fences over a varied terrain.

This is a schooling show run according to USEA rules where applicable.

Each Division will have 3 classes. Riders may enter any number of classes. If more than 8 riders enter a class, classes will be further divided in A and B.

- 1. No classes will be ridden out of order.
- 2. Horses may compete in more than one division
- 3. Riders may complete in unlimited classes
- 4. No same day entries are accepted. No changes are allowed day of show.
- 5. Optimum times are based on USEA rules. Time penalties will be accrued if optimum time is exceeded except for the Intro divisions.
- 6. **Jumps offs**: Competitors having no time penalties or jumping faults will go to the jump off round. Jumps offs will be run over a shortened stadium jump course and fastest time will win. Jump off courses will be posted on the morning of the jumper derby.
- 7. Courses will be open for walking immediately prior to each Division.
- 8. Attire: Informal to casual. Breeches will paddock boots and half chaps or tall riding boots. Helmets are required and safety vests are encouraged. Medical armbands strongly recommended.
- 9. All minors must be accompanied by a parent or designated guardian
- 10. Tack and Equipment: Any English saddle is permitted. Bell boots, jumping boots or splint boots are permitted.
- 11. Fence heights:
 - a. Intro stadium cross rails, XC jumps up to 18 inches
 - b. Starter 2' 2'3"
 - c. Beginner novice 2'3" 2'7"
 - d. Novice 2'3" to 2'11"

RULES FOR SCORING THE JUMPING DERBY

Scoring based on combination USEF Rulebook 2025 - EV128 (Show Jumping) & EV123 (Cross-Country)

12. Must have clear round to go to jump-off (no jumping penalties and no time penalties)

NOTE: Intro Division Only: The first round will not be timed, only the jump-off.

Disobediences

- A. The following are considered as disobediences and are penalized as such:
 - 1. A refusal
 - 2. A run-out
 - 3. A resistance
 - 4. A more or less regular circle or group of circles no matter where they occur on the course for whatever reason. It is also a disobedience to circle around the last obstacle jumped unless the track of the course so requires.
- B. Notwithstanding the above, it is not considered to be a disobedience to circle for up to 45 seconds after a run-out or a refusal (no matter if the obstacle has to be rebuilt or not) to get into position to jump an obstacle.

Refusals

- A. It is a refusal when a horse halts in front of an obstacle, which it must jump whether or not the horse knocks it down or displaces it.
- B. Stopping in front of an obstacle without moving backwards and without knocking it down, followed immediately by a standing jump is not penalized.
- C. If the halt is prolonged, if the horse steps back, either voluntarily or not, even a single pace, it is a refusal.
